**Montreal, November 10, 2022 - The Board of Directors of Humanity & Inclusion (HI) Canada is proud to announce the appointment of Anne Delorme as Executive Director. She takes over the leadership of the Canadian association this week.**

With nearly 20 years of experience in the international development, humanitarian and philanthropic fields, Ms. Delorme is taking over the reins of the Canadian association.

"I am very happy to join the Humanity & Inclusion team and to be able to contribute to its exceptional and unique mission in Canada: to fight for human dignity and to support the most vulnerable populations, especially people with disabilities, around the world. It is an honour for me to join an organization with such reputation. 2022 is a particularly important year, marking the 25 years of the Ottawa Treaty and the International Campaign to Ban Landmines, for which Humanity & Inclusion won the Nobel Peace Prize. Our new Director has held a variety of positions managing complex development programs and teams in Canadian and international non-governmental organizations, including the United Nations Development Program. Formerly Director of the "Act Together for Inclusion" Fund, co-managed by Equitas - International Centre for Human Rights Education and the Dignity Canada Network, she was also the coordinator of the



Comité québécois femmes et développement at the Association québécoise des organismes de coopération internationale. Since 2015, Ms. Delorme has been offering her expertise as a senior consultant in international development for organizations: Développement international Desjardins, the Assemblée des parlementaires de la Francophonie, and Médecins du Monde.

Her arrival comes at a pivotal time for our international solidarity organization as we celebrate our 40th anniversary this year and the 25th anniversary of the Nobel Peace Prize, awarded to HI and its partners in the International Campaign to Ban Landmines on December 10.
